1) REPORTS

a) President's report

Review of Cameron Johnston Memorial: Plaque will be presented to Johnston's for them to place on memorial in their own time and in privacy out of respect for the family. Thank you to all the members of the board and to Jason Mueller and Ryan Mitchell for their assistance in making this all possible.

Big year for making improvements to the diamond #1; dugouts etc

Met with R.M re the new community recreation center. Looks like there may be potential for field house/storage facilities/meeting rooms etc

b) Vice Presidents Report

Chicken Daze parade went well with the unfortunate vacancy of the Special Events Coordinator. Walked with the parade participants instead of a float. Seem to address the issue of missing/late parents etc. Perhaps this is a solution to avoiding the issue of reuniting parade participants with their parents at the end of the parade. Less participants then last year, however there was a good showing by the younger generation of Springfield players.

c) Secretaries Report

The remaining goody bags from the Chicken Daze Parade were given to the Rally Cap Coordinator for the wind up.

d) Treasurer's Report

Currently sitting with \$18,955.09 in our account. The money donated in June 2019 (\$3300) by the Dugald Ag Society is to be reserved for improvements at The Dugald Stadium.

The money donated in July 2019 (\$4000) by the RM for continued improvements at the diamonds. Pending a \$1000 donation from the Springfield Orthodox members for Dugald Diamonds



e) Registrar's Report

Total of 24 teams, consisting of 215 players, which is more players than previous years. The online registration thru RRV greatly assists the registrar.

Rally Cap: Numbers were up, total of 72 players making up 12 teams

Grand Slam: 53 players making 6 teams Mosquito: 32 players making 3 teams Peewee: 15 players making 1 teams

Bantam: 20 players Midget: 23 players

Some players made the AA/AAA teams which affected the numbers

Age Advancing and finding coaches are a trouble area; unsure if there is a solution to the last minutes scramble

Per Dan Cox:

RRV is looking to transition to the same online program that Baseball Manitoba uses; saves RRV making the rosters for Baseball Manitoba. With the same online program, Baseball Manitoba will be responsible for making the rosters. Registrants may have to create a new player profile for registration. The payment will still go to RRV, and registration will still be linked to the RRV website. There still will be a in person registration.

Possible suggestion for avoiding the last minute scramble for coaches and filling the rosters is to start the AA/AAA tryouts earlier.

f) Uniform Manager's Report

Outfitted 6 teams this season. The purchase of the additional POD has greatly assisted in keeping the equipment and uniforms organized. Have created a inventory list to make sure that everything is accounted for.

Ordered one set of Peewee jerseys' however they were returned to Keystone due to the quality.

The snapback hats that were purchased made it easier to outfit all players. There is still 41 hats remaining.

Late returns of equipment/uniforms was minimal, however suggesting that a date (ie:September 1ST) be placed on the bond cheques, and cashed instead of being lenient. Creates problems further down the line when chasing people down for equipment, and accurate inventory accounts.

Baseball Manitoba stepped up to outfit the RallyCap players when Dairy Queen backed out.

g) Equipment Manager's Report

Replaced some catchers equipment, have a good inventory of equipment. The 2nd POD assists in keeping everything organized. The boxes at the diamonds helped. Need to install a better pitching rubber at the Dugald diamonds. Also, look into the rubber insert used at the Oakbank diamond instead of the baseball plugs that get damaged when diamonds are being raked etc.

h) Scheduler's Report

Scheduling has become less tedious now that RRV organizing it. Slight issue with grand slam ie: 2 Oakbank Grand Slam teams playing in Winnipeg when the Oakbank diamonds were vacant. Was able to remedy this issue with Grand Slam coordinator.

Batting cage was used frequently.

i) Player Development Manager Report
